As a result, it is aimed at a comprehensive scientific study of the problem considered on this topic.

Discussion and Results

The changes and economic reforms carried out in our country in recent years have significantly changed the socio-economic picture of our country, various mechanisms and approaches to supporting families have been formed in the country, ensuring demographic security. In particular, in the Samarkand region, large-scale work is being carried out to effectively implement directions that correspond to the trends in population migration, its movement, territorial mobility of the population and are commensurate with the conditions of structural transformation of the economy. As A. Kh. Abdullayev noted in his research; "In the Republic of Uzbekistan, a certain system of state regulation of the migration process, citizens' departure abroad for work, education, residence abroad and return has been formed. The state's migration policy is based on universal and national moral values, moral principles such as humanity, nationalism, patriotism, interethnic solidarity, and tolerance. In particular, the legislative system of our

country related to migration is also formed on the basis of moral principles such as humanism, nationalism, and patriotism"[3].

This article will examine the demographic development of population migration using the example of the Samarkand region.

The current demographic situation of the Samarkand region, its demographic potential - in turn, can be a good opportunity to bring it to a new stage of economic development. The population of the Samarkand region has been growing rapidly over the years of independence. In particular, as of April 1, 2023, the number of permanent residents in the region was 4,137.9 thousand people, while as of January 1, 2024, it was 4,208.5 thousand people, an increase of 90.3 thousand people, or 2.2%, since the beginning of 2023 [4].

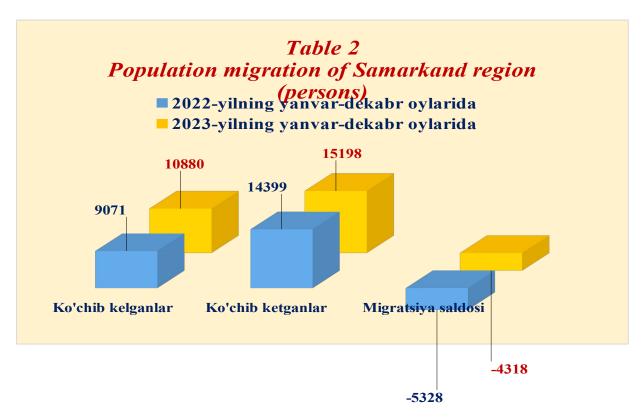

In general, the prospects of population migration play an important role in the overall development of the country, regions and society, in demographic development. Population migration is associated with its own internal and external processes and has its own impact on social and economic development. Population migration helps to increase material income by involving people in jobs or economic activities. This leads to increased economic development of the country.

Migration indicators are used to study the migratory movement of various social groups in certain historical periods of the development of society in the world and its individual regions. In particular, when studying the migration process from a demographic perspective, its indicators are analyzed in detail.

According to demographic data of the Samarkand region [4], the migration balance in January-December 2023 was minus 40,318 people (minus 5,328 people in the same period in 2022). The most big minus remains Urgut (minus 892), Pakhtachi (minus 814) and In the Ishtikhan (minus 685) districts observed (see Table 2).



There are several types of population migration, such as those that are carried out for legal, social, economic or political reasons, and their interrelationships are understood. Migration usually becomes an active list of jobs, is necessary for ensuring economic and social development, and also ensures the entry of new foreign participation into independent countries. Migration can absorb the strength, experience and knowledge of other countries, but it can also create a number of problems and lead to good or bad demand. Such changes can create problematic situations for governments and societies.

As researcher M. Tursunov noted; "Population migration is a process that occurs in time and space, in this process the population must necessarily cross some territorial border (for example, state, region, district, city, etc.) and the time of migration (permanent, temporary, etc.) must be clear. According to the territorial sign or direction, population migration is divided into external and internal migrations. Throughout the development of mankind, external migration has played a major role. Because in this process, the population is redistributed between continents and countries, and its number and composition have always changed. Internal migration, on the other hand, since it occurs within countries,

does not lead to a change in the total number and composition of the population of countries, but to an internal territorial redistribution of the population "[5; 213].

Migration movements of the population of Samarkand region began to occur based on the citizens' own will and choices. In the migration of the region's population, by 2023, those who emigrated outnumbered those who arrived, that is, minus 1219 people. In 2022, this figure was 1595 people. (See Table 3).
